North European Championship Sporting Regulations 2018

1. Championship

This is the Sporting Regulations for:

Formula Basic NEZ North European Championship 2018 (Short: F Basic NEZ Championship 2018). These Sporting Regulations come into force from the moment they are published on the NEZ web-cite www.fia-nez.eu, where possible changes, bulletins etc, will be published.

2. Title and Jurisdiction

The **F Basic NEZ Championship 2018** is handled by the NEZ Racing Commission in association with respectively ASN's Racing Commissions or their representatives within the NEZ. The entrants are enforced to follow the General Sporting Regulations from hosting ASN. Competitors must ensure that their cars comply with the conditions of eligibility and safety throughout qualifying and racing.

3. Eligible Drivers

The events will be national and are open to drivers with an appropriate, valid driver's license, including startingpermission from their respectively ASN. Only drivers with a license issued by an ASN within the NEZ-countries and have entered the Championship (see § 8 below) can score points. The entry to be confirmed by the Representative, § 13 below.

4. Eligible Cars

Cars must fulfill requirements of the Formula Basic Technical Regulations 2018.

Noice level according to General Technical Regulations from the hosting ASN.

5. Categories/Group

6. Championship Rounds 2018

Norway; 11-13 May: Våler

Sweden; 28-29 Juli: Kinnekulle Ring Norway; 10-12 Aug: Rudskogen

7. Points

Each heat will count towards the Championship, point will be awarded based as below:

Pos.	1 st	2 nd	3 rd	4 th	5 th	6 th	7 th	8 th	9 th	10 th	11 th
Points	25	15	12	10	8	6	5	4	3	2	1

The winner of the **F Basic NEZ Championship 2018** is the driver awarded most points after the last heat. In the situation of 2 drivers ending up having equal points after the last race, the winner will be determined by following.

- 1. Most wins. (1st places)
- 2. Most second places (2nd places)
- 3. Most third places (3rd places)
- 4. Best position in the last race
- 5. Best result in the previous round
- 6. Winning by the furthest distance (time gap) to 2nd place in the first counting round

Participants are awarded NEZ points after the participant's position at the finish line and also to the drivers who have completed 80% of the class winner's total distance. (DNF before completed 80% will not lead to points).

9. Free Practice, Qualifying and Race

Saturday: Practice. Qualifying heat 1.

- Grid for heat 1 will be determined by timed qualification.
- The driver, who has reached the fastest qualification laptime, will start at pole position.
 Sunday:
- Grid for heat 2 will be determined by respectively result in heat 1.

12. Time-keeping
